In partnership with Columbia Southern University and Waldorf University, American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., will once again offer scholarships to members of our organization. Each institution will offer one scholarship, and the application period will open on June 15, 2024, and close on August 31, 2024. The scholarship will cover up to one online degree program (associate, bachelor, or master). The scholarship will be applied directly to the recipient's tuition for up to 60 semester hours or 36 consecutive months in the selected online degree program, whichever comes first. This scholarship covers tuition and course technology fees only.

The American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., Patriot Scholarship will be open to any AGSM Member or Associate Member of AGSM. The recipient must have been a member in good standing for at least two years, and they must maintain membership throughout the period of the scholarship. Those eligible to be an Associate Member of AGSM are traditionally an underserved population in the Survivor community, and this will be a groundbreaking opportunity for them. Honoring Mothers of Fallen Heroes who continue the service of their sons and daughters

Columbia Southern University is partnering with American Gold Star Mothers to offer a scholarship to one of its members. The scholarship will cover up to one online degree program (associate, bachelor, or master). The scholarship will be applied directly to the recipient's tuition for up to 60 semester hours or 36 consecutive months in the selected online degree program, whichever comes first.

This scholarship covers tuition and course technology fees only.

Eligibility

An American Gold Star Mothers member in good standing for the last two years and must retain membership while on scholarship.

Application Essay Questions

Proposed Bylaws Change - National Executive Board

<u>*NOTE:</u> Underlining and strike-through text is added for emphasis only to draw attention to specific proposed changes and will not appear in the final, approved version.

40. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article I - Organization

Sec. 3. Those who desire to form a Chapter shall make application for a charter to the President of the Department in which they reside. The charter shall be issued by the National President and National Secretary upon receipt of the application properly executed by the charter members of the proposed Chapter.

Proposed:

Sec. 3. Those who desire to form a Chapter shall notify the Department President and make application for a charter to the National Service Officer. The charter application shall be reviewed by the National Executive Board to ensure it is properly executed by the charter members of the proposed Chapter. If approved, a charter shall be issued and signed by the National President and National Secretary.

Rationale: Applications for charters are submitted to the National Service Officer and approved by the National Executive Board.

41. Proposed:

Chapter Bylaws - Article I - Organization

Add new Section 6: Sec. 6. Each Chapter, by vote of its members, may designate the amount of its annual Chapter dues.

Rationale: To allow each Chapter to determine if they will have Chapter dues.

42. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article II - Officers

Sec. 2. The Chapter President may appoint a Corresponding Secretary, Historian, Custodian of Records, Community Service Chairman, VAVS Chairman, Americanism Chairman and, if deemed necessary by the Chapter, a Parliamentarian and Legislative Chairman.

Proposed:

Sec. 2. The Chapter President may appoint a Corresponding Secretary, Historian, Custodian of Records, Community Service Chairman, VAVS Chairman, Americanism Chairman and, if deemed necessary by the Chapter, a Parliamentarian and Legislative Chairman.

Rationale: Only one Chapter and one Department currently lists this as a role they staff. As Chapters operate, this is no longer a role currently utilized.

43. Proposed:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

Replace paragraphs delineated by alphabetic designation with Section numbers. Thus, it will be: Sec. 1. The Chapter President ... Sec. 2. The Chapter First Vice President ... Etc. Sec. 15. The Chapter Community Service Chair ...

Rationale: Clerical/administrative changes to be consistent with the section designations throughout the remainder of the C&BL document.

44. Proposed:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

With the clerical change listed above, add the following sentence at the end of the description of duties of Sections 1 through 15.

"She shall perform other duties as assigned and at the request of the National President."

Rationale: The listing of duties describes the general nature of each officers' duties and responsibilities. However, they should not be construed as an exhaustive list. All Department Board members may be required to perform duties outside of their normal responsibilities as needed for the operation of the organization.

45. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

With the clerical change listed above, the duties of the Department President becomes new Section 1.

(a) THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT shall perform the duties and exercise the powers usually incident to the chief executive's office. She shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter. She shall appoint all committees and is an ex officio member of same, except the Nominating Committee. She shall act as judge at all elections and obligate new members. She shall sign all checks drawn on the treasury for appropriations of money. All questions of debate shall be decided by vote of the Chapter.

Proposed:

Sec. 1. THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT shall perform the duties and exercise the powers usually incident to the chief executive's office. She shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter. She shall appoint all committees and shall be an ex officio member of same, except the Nominating Committee. She shall act as judge at all elections and obligate new members. She shall <u>approve all expenditures and</u> sign checks drawn on the treasury for appropriations of money. All questions of debate shall be decided by vote of the Chapter.

Rationale: It is important for the President to approve all expenses. The procedure for handling debated issues is covered in Robert's Rules of Order, which governs all AGSM meetings.

46. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

With the clerical change listed above, the duties of the Chapter Treasurer becomes new Section 6.

(f) THE CHAPTER TREASURER shall receive and disburse all funds of the Chapter, keep accurate accounts and give a statement of the financial condition of the Chapter at each meeting and at the end of her term. She shall pay all claims approved by the Chapter. She shall screen all new membership applications and send the application fee to the Department Treasurer. She shall notify all members when dues are payable and shall send annual Department and National per capitas to the Department Treasurer by January 15th of each year. She shall have the books audited before the end of her term by three members of the Chapter, appointed by the President. Three signatures are required on all bank accounts, namely: Chapter President, Chapter Treasurer and one other officer, with any one signature required on Chapter checks.

Proposed:

Sec. 6. THE CHAPTER TREASURER shall receive and disburse all funds of the Chapter, keep accurate accounts and give a statement of the financial condition of the Chapter at each meeting and at the end of her term. She shall pay all claims approved by the Chapter. She shall screen all new membership applications and send the application fee to the Department Treasurer. She shall notify all members when dues are payable and shall send annual Department and National per capitas to the Department Treasurer by January 15th of each year. She shall have the books audited before the end of her term by three members of the Chapter, appointed by the President. Three signatures are required on all bank accounts, namely: Chapter President, Chapter Treasurer and one other officer, with any one signature required on Chapter checks.

Rationale: The Chapter Treasurer does not screen new membership applications. That is the function of the National Service Officer. With new compliance procedures, Chapters should address who will be signatories on their checking account in the Chapter's Standing Rules.

47. Proposed:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

Section (h) - Custodian of Records - eliminate this paragraph.

Rationale: Only one Chapter and one Department currently lists this as a role they staff. As Departments operate, this is no longer a role currently utilized.

48. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article III - Duties of Officers

With the clerical change listed above and the elimination of Sec. (h), the duties of the Chapter VAVS Chair becomes new Sec. 11.

(I) THE CHAPTER VAVS CHAIRMAN shall render such services as the

Chapter directs to hospitalized veterans through the Department of Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service Representative and in other facilities through the proper authorities.

Proposed:

Sec. 11. THE CHAPTER VAVS CHAIRMAN shall render such services as the Chapter directs to coordinate and encourage volunteer service for <u>all agencies in the VA system</u> and render a report of such activities to the Department VAVS Chair.

Rationale: Service to Veterans within the VA system has grown to include more than just hospital-based services (e.g., Vet Centers, nursing homes, clinics, etc.).

49. Proposed:

Chapter Bylaws - Article IV - Duties of a Chapter

Add the following new Section 4.

4. To maintain compliance with all financial reporting requirements as shall be promulgated by the Internal Revenue Service, the state within which the Department operates and the National Executive Board.

Rationale: To add the requirement to maintain compliance with IRS and state regulations going forward.

50. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article V - Meetings

Sec. 2. The quorum necessary to hold a business meeting shall be determined according to the membership of the Chapter by vote of the Chapter.

Proposed:

Sec. 2. The quorum necessary to hold a business meeting shall be determined according to the membership of the Chapter as outlined in the Chapter's Standing Rules.

Rationale: To allow the Chapter to determine their operating procedures based on what works best for them.

51. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article VI - Conventions

Sec. 1. Each Chapter President, by virtue of her office, shall be a delegate to Department and National Conventions with one vote. She shall have no alternate. In addition, the Department President, Past Department Presidents and VAVS Representatives have a vote at Department Board Meetings and Department Conventions.

Proposed:

Sec. 1. Each Chapter President, by virtue of her office, shall be a delegate to Department and National Conventions with one vote. She shall have no alternate. In addition, the Department President, Past Department Presidents and VAVS Representatives have a vote at Department Board Meetings and Department Conventions.

Rationale: This language pertains to Departments and not Chapters.

52. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article VI - Conventions

Sec. 2. Each Chapter in good standing is entitled to be represented CONTINUED ON PAGE 10

PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE - NATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD

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by one delegate and one alternate for every five members or major fraction thereof.

Proposed:

Sec. 2. Each <u>chartered</u> Chapter in good standing is entitled to be represented by one delegate and one alternate for every five members or major fraction thereof.

Rationale: Members are "in good standing," not Chapters. Chapters are chartered.

53. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article IX - Dues

Sec. 2. (d) Members requesting a transfer from one Chapter to another must be in good standing in the Chapter she is leaving. The Chapter receiving such a transfer must vote in favor of the transfer for the transfer to be effective.

Proposed:

Eliminate this subsection altogether in this section of the Chapter Bylaws.

Rationale: The process for transfers between Chapters is a function of AGSM National and is proposed to be moved to Article III of the National Constitution, as outlined above.

54. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article XI - Discipline



Giving Grace Grant

Applications are being accepted

The Grants Committee is currently accepting applications for the AGSM GivingGrace Grant. Qualifying events eligible for grant application include utility expenses(heating, electricity, water, etc.), housing (mortgage/rent), emergency housing repairs, food, medical /health care needs, and transportation issues (car repairs).

Please contact the Giving Grace Grant Committee Chair at AGSMGrants@AmericanGoldStarMothers.org Any Chapter failing to meet its obligations as outlined in the Constitution and Bylaws or ceasing to function for six months as a Chapter of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., or refusing to pay any Department and National per capita shall upon order of the National Executive Board surrender its charter for cancellation. Upon failure to surrender such charter, immediate steps may be taken by the National Executive Board for its revocation, suspension or cancellation. See Article XI of the Constitution.

Proposed:

Discipline shall be outlined in Article XI of the National Constitution and Code of Procedure of the same Article.

Rationale: The procedure for discipline is outlined in Article XI of the National Constitution and Code of Procedure of the same Article. The procedure for discipline should be consistent across both Departments and Chapters.

55. Current:

Chapter Bylaws - Article XII - Standing Rules

A Chapter may adopt Standing Rules at any regular business meeting, providing said Standing Rules have been read at the previous business meeting or have been mailed to each member of the Chapter at least fifteen days prior to the date of meeting at which the vote will be taken on them. All proposed Standing Rules must be approved by the Department Board as not being contrary to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Proposed:

A Chapter shall adopt Standing Rules. The Standing Rules should be reviewed annually and proposed changes voted on at a regular business meeting. Standing Rules shall be submitted for approval to the Department Board as not being contrary to the National Constitution and Bylaws. Once approved, a copy of the Chapter Standing Rules shall be submitted to the National Secretary to be included in the Chapter's files at Headquarters.

Rationale: To address new compliance requirements and how each Chapter will handle compliance, Standing Rules will outline the procedures they will follow. As part of the duties of a Department to manage Chapters, they are the proper entity to perform the review of the Chapter's Standing Rules.

Additional Proposed Change – NEB

Current:

National Bylaws - Article IV - Eligibility and Membership Sec. 7. - Gold Star Fathers, Gold Star Siblings and Gold Star Grandparents are eligible to join as Associate Members. They pay no dues, hold no office and have no vote, but may be appointed as a Deputy to the representative at the VA Medical Center

Proposed:

Sec. 7. - Gold Star Fathers, Gold Star Siblings, Gold Star Grandparents and Gold Star Stepfathers are eligible to join as Associate Members. They pay no dues, hold no office, and have no vote, but may be appointed as a Deputy to the representative at the VA Medical Center.

Rationale: For many years, Stepfathers have been accepted as Associate Members. This change is proposed simply to codify what is already being done.



87th Annual National Convention Rules

- 1. The 87th Annual National Convention will officially begin Saturday morning.
- 2. The printed program is the official order of business, subject to change as need may arise.
- All Delegates, Department Presidents, Chapter Presidents, Past National Presidents and Officers, National Officers, Members, Associate Members and Guests will be required to complete the proper registration form.
- 4. Proper identification badges will be required for admission to all official Convention functions.
- 5. Only Members and Associate Members with proper identification badges shall be admitted to the business meeting.
- Registration will close at 7:30 a.m. Saturday. If a Delegate is unable to vote due to illness or any other reason beyond her control, the Alternate may have her badge changed from Alternate to Delegate provided she does so before 8:00 a.m. local time on Saturday.
- 7. All cell phones and other mobile devices should be turned off during the meetings of the National Convention. Ring of a phone will result in a donation of \$50.00 to the charity of the National Presidents choice. This year's charity shall be for Mount Carmel Veterans Center.
- 8. There shall be no voting by proxy.
- 9. There shall be no electronic recording of any portion of the business meeting except as directed by the National President.
- 10. Delegates, Alternates and non-voting members present in the Convention room will be seated in assigned sections.
- 11. A member wishing to speak shall raise her hand or stand, as directed by the National President, to be recognized. After being recognized for the first time, she will address the Chair as "Madam President," state her name in full and identify her Chapter and Department before proceeding. If she is a National Officer, she shall give her name and the office she holds.
- 12. Anyone speaking without being recognized by the National President (or other presiding officer) will be asked to sit down. If the third request is not complied with, the person will be escorted from the room by the Sergeant-at-Arms and will not be allowed to return to the meeting.
- No more than one (1) minute will be allowed for any Delegate, Alternate or Member to speak from the floor. No Delegate, Alternate, or Member may speak more than twice on the same subject, except by consent of the National President.

- 14. All Resolutions presented by the Resolutions Committee shall be read and voted upon following the reading and discussion. Delegates may also present Resolutions from the floor of the Convention.
- 15. The Constitution and Bylaws Committee shall present proposed amendments which have been reviewed by the National Executive Board and printed in the National newsletter with at least thirty (30) days' prior notice. Proposed amendments may be presented from the floor of the Convention but must receive a unanimous vote to pass.
- 16. The Nominations Committee shall present the slate of nominations at the Saturday business meeting of the Convention. Any nominations from the floor shall be presented immediately following.
- 17. Candidates nominated from the floor must be prepared with a letter of endorsement for the Chair of the Nominations Committee. Such letter of endorsement shall comply with all criteria set out in the 2024 Convention Call published in the March-April National newsletter. Letters of endorsement will not be returned.
- 18. A nominee whose name is on the slate presented by the Nominations Committee who has opposition from the floor shall have her qualifications read by the Chair of the Nominations Committee.
- All votes will be submitted electronically, using the login information provided to all registered Delegates in advance of the opening of Convention.
- 20. The National President shall appoint an election judge and tellers. In the event paper ballots are necessary due to extenuating circumstances, only the judge and tellers will be allowed in the room where such paper ballots are being tallied.
- 21. All messages and communications shall be carried by the National Sergeant-at-Arms to the proper recipient.
- 22. No publicity, pictures or screenshot capture of information shall be released except through and as authorized by the National President.
- 23. White is the preferred official dress code of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., to be worn to the meetings of the National Convention.
- 24. Once the opening ceremony and business meeting starts, no one shall be permitted to enter or leave the room. If there is an emergency, a Page will escort you out of the meeting.
- 25. Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern all meetings of the National Convention.

Vietnam War Veterans Day 29 March 2024
